INDIA

With an approximate 15% fall in the number of new cases and an impressive 85.25% recovery rate, India is making a positive comeback.

Unlock 5.0 - MOVING FORWARD

The process of relaxing lockdown rules continues within the country with permissions to operate cinemas, multiplexes, and theatres at 50% capacity with effect from 15 October.

The government has further relaxed limits on public gatherings, both indoor and outdoor. B2B Exhibitions can be organised outside containment zones after 15 October as per directives issued by concerned authorities.

With the onset of festive season, most states in India have opened up for tourism and there has been a promising rise in domestic tourism. States like Goa, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Sikkim, Uttarakhand, and others are witnessing a steady inflow of domestic tourists. Goa witnessed an unprecedented rise in domestic tourists over the long weekend of Gandhi Jayanti (02 October).

Keeping the spirits going, the Ministry of Tourism and Culture has decided to equip 75 iconic destinations of India with excellent visitor facilities. The project is slated to complete in time for India's 75th year of independence in 2022.

All monuments, entertainment parks, and similar places are now allowed to open and can operate as per the directives issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. State governments can decide on the final operational status.
