Indian nationals, or nationals of Nepal or Bhutan stranded in Russia, all Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) and Person of Indian Origin (PIO) cardholders holding passports of other countries, Russian citizens travelling to India for any purpose other than tourism, and seamen from Russian countries can travel between Russia and India under this arrangement.

Cultural festivities are also on the rise with many taking to online platforms and others to hybrid formats. Madhya Pradesh government organised the Mandu festival in Mandu on 13 and 14 February 2021. It displayed many interesting aspects of the history of the place and showcased independent artistes and musical bands through performances.
