STATE INITIATIVES

While Uttar Pradesh government has announced the grant of INR 100 crore each for the development of tourism facilities in Varanasi and Ayodhya, the Rajasthan budget has allocated INR 500 crore in the Tourism Development Fund. The government will use the funds for a series of developmental infrastructure programs to increase tourist inflow to places like Ajmer, Jaipur, and Udaipur.

In Karnataka, the Chief Minister has laid the foundation stone for a new airport at Vijayapura (Bijapur) with a hope that once completed; it will boost tourism to the historical city and improve regional connectivity. The Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation's "Ramayan Special" train has begun its maiden journey from Indore on 28 February 2021 with full occupancy. The route will cover destinations that are significant to the epic.

Himachal Pradesh has allowed river rafting and paragliding in additional sites to boost adventure tourism in the state. It is also looking to explore other adventure activities and promotion of unexplored areas. While these measures are important to revive tourism in the different states, the focus is largely on sustainable development.
